## **MOTION FOR ORDER TO SHOW CAUSE**

Comes now, M. Gale Lemmon, attorney for Complainant, and hereby moves the commissioner for an Order to Show Cause why Respondent's Utah title insurance agent's license should not be revoked for failure to obey an Order of the commissioner in the above-entitled matter. In support of its motion, Complainant shows as follows:

- 1. In an Order dated May 23, 2011, in the above-entitled matter, Respondent Michael T. Moss ("Moss") was granted a title marketing agent's license.
- 2. As a part of the Order granting Mr. Moss' license, Mr. Moss was ordered to allow the license of The Title Insurance Agency license to lapse and not renew that license. The Title Insurance Agency's license lapsed on May 31, 2011.
  - 3. Also, as a part of that Order, Mr. Moss was also ordered to assure that The Title

Insurance Agency was in compliance with all insurance laws prior to the lapse of the license, including payment of all assessments and fees due and the filing of all past due reports for the agency.

- 4. Respondent failed to obey the Order of the commissioner in failing to file the past due reports for The Title Insurance Agency and to pay outstanding assessments and fees due in the amount of \$425.00. The past due reports remain unfiled, and the outstanding assessments and fees remain unpaid as of the date of this Motion.
- 5. Pursuant to Utah Code Annotated §§ 31A-2-308 and 31A-23a-111(5)(b)(ii)(C), if a licensee fails to obey an order of the commissioner, he may assess forfeitures of up to \$2,500.00 per violation and may suspend or revoke Respondent's license.
- 6. Because Respondent failed to obey the Order previously made in this matter, the commissioner should now revoke Respondent's license and order Respondent to pay an administrative forfeiture in an amount to be designated by the commissioner for violation of that Order.
