- 5. Respondent is acting herein free from any duress or operation of any kind or nature, having been advised fully as to his rights set forth herein.
- 6. Respondent acknowledges that the issuance of this Order by the Commissioner is solely for purpose of disposition of the matter entitled herein.

Based upon the foregoing Stipulation and information in the file, the Presiding Officer makes the following Findings of Fact:

FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. On December 12, 2010, Respondent completed the licensing application for a Utah insurance license.
- On January 24, 2011, the department's licensing division received notification from
 the Bureau of Criminal Identification that the Respondent had plead guilty on November 10,
 2009, to one misdemeanor count of Unlawful Purchase, Possession, or Consumption by a Minor.
 - 4. Respondent failed to report this charge and conviction on his application for license.
- 5. When contacted by the investigator, Respondent fully cooperated, took responsibility for his actions, and agreed to a forfeiture.

Based upon the foregoing Stipulation and Findings of Fact, the Presiding Officer enters the following Conclusions of Law:

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

- 1. Utah Code Ann. § 31A-23a-105 requires that a licensed individual or agency producer report to the commissioner any criminal prosecution taken against the person in any jurisdiction. The report is to be filed at the time the person files an application for a license and within 30 days of the initial appearance before the court. In addition, the report must include a copy of the complaint or other relevant documents related to the action or prosecution.
- 2. By failing to report the criminal conviction to the commissioner, Respondent violated the above statutory provision.
 - 3. An administrative forfeiture in the amount of \$500.00 is appropriate in this matter.

Based upon the foregoing Stipulation, Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, the Presiding Officer herewith enters the following Order:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

Respondent Skyler L. Chambers is hereby assessed an administrative forfeiture of \$500.00 to be paid to the Commissioner within 30 days of entry of this Order.

NOTIFICATION

You are hereby notified that a failure to obey an Order of the Commissioner may subject you to further penalties, including forfeiture of up to \$2,500.00 per violation and the suspension or revocation of your license, and the filing of an action in district court, which may impose forfeitures of us to \$10,000 per day for continued violation.

You are further notified that other jurisdictions in which you may be licensed may require that you report this action to them.
