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The Utah Insurance Department (“the Department”) has commenced this informal adjudicative proceeding pursuant to Utah Code §§ 31A-2-201 and 63G-4-201; Utah Admin. Code R 590-160. Based on information contained in agency files or known to the Utah Insurance Commissioner, the Commissioner enters the following:

Findings of Fact

1. Respondent, Sommer R. Bowler, 3132 South Aurora Lane, Washington, Utah 84780, is licensed as an individual resident producer, License #129960.
2. On or about December 1, 2016, Respondent pled guilty to three felony charges involving fraudulent insurance acts. As part of Respondent’s plea, she agreed to the immediate revocation of her Utah insurance license. (See, Statement of Defendant in Support of Guilty Plea and Certificates of Counsel attached hereto as Exhibit “A”.)

Conclusions of Law

1. After an informal adjudicative proceeding, the Utah Insurance Commissioner may revoke a licensee's insurance license if sufficient grounds are found. Utah Code § 31A-23a-111(5)(b).

2. Under Utah Code § 31A-23a-111(5)(b)(xiv) and (xv), the Commissioner may revoke the license of a licensee if the Commissioner finds that the licensee is convicted of a felony or admits or is found to have committed an insurance fraud.

3. Because Sommer Bowler admitted insurance fraud and as a result, was convicted of a felony, there would be grounds for the revocation of her insurance license.


4. In this informal adjudicative proceeding, the Commissioner has sufficient legal authority to revoke Sommer R. Bowler's insurance license.

Order

Based on the Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is ordered:

1. The insurance license of Sommer R. Bowler, License No. 129960, is revoked.
2. This Order shall become final fifteen days after it is electronically mailed to Respondent unless a request for a hearing is received from Respondent prior to that date at uidadmincases@utah.gov. A request for hearing shall be signed by the person making the request and shall state the basis for the relief requested.

If you request a hearing in this matter, please send a request via electronic mail to uidadmindcases@utah.gov. Failure to request a hearing will be deemed a failure to exhaust administrative remedies and will preclude any further administrative or judicial review or appeal of this matter.

If you fail to request a hearing you will be bound by the above Order. Failure to obey the Order may subject you to further penalties that include forfeitures of up to \$2,500 per violation, license suspension or revocation, further enforcement action before the Utah District Court where forfeitures of up to \$10,000 may be imposed.

If you are licensed in other jurisdictions, you may be required to report this action to those jurisdictions.
