

1. Respondent's Individual Resident Producer License No. 561488 is revoked.
2. Pursuant to Utah Code § 63G-4-203(1)(i) and Utah Admin. Code R590-160-7(1), this informal adjudicative proceeding shall be deemed closed, and this Order shall become final and take full effect, 15 days after this Notice of Agency Action and Order is mailed to Respondent unless a request for a hearing on this matter is received from Respondent prior to that date.
3. A request for a hearing shall be sent by email to uidadmincases@utah.gov or by U.S. mail to Office of the Administrative Law Judge, Utah Insurance Department, 3110 State Office Building, Salt Lake City, UT 84114. The request for hearing shall be signed by the person making the request and shall state the basis for the relief requested.
4. If you fail to request a hearing you will be bound by this Order. Failure to request a hearing will be deemed a failure to exhaust administrative remedies and will preclude any further administrative or judicial review or appeal of this matter.

NOTICE REGARDING ENFORCEMENT OF THE ORDER

Failure to obey the Order may subject you to further penalties that include forfeitures of up to \$2,500 per violation, license suspension or revocation, further enforcement action before the Utah District Court where forfeitures of up to \$10,000 may be imposed. If you are licensed in other jurisdictions, you may be required to report this proceeding to those jurisdictions.

DECLARATION


Under criminal penalty of Utah law, I, Connie Nowland, declare the following:

1. I am currently employed as a Market Conduct Examiner with the Utah Insurance Department (“Department”) where my responsibilities include investigating and enforcing Utah insurance laws.
2. I submit this Declaration as the basis for issuing the Notice of Agency Action and Order against Clint William Nordahl to which this Declaration is attached.
3. Based on my personal knowledge and/or based on the facts appearing in the Department’s records and files, the following facts are true:
 - a. Respondent is an Individual Resident Producer authorized to do insurance business in the State of Utah. Respondent’s License No. is 561488.
 - b. On January 22, 2019, in Case No. 181907747, State of Utah Attorney General v. Clint William Nordahl, Respondent was convicted of Securities Fraud, a second degree felony, and Pattern of Unlawful Activity, a second degree felony.
 - c. Based on these convictions, Respondent was sentenced to one term of 3 to 15 years in the Utah State Prison and one term of 1 to 15 years in the Utah State Prison.
 - d. The Respondent is currently incarcerated and serving these sentences.
4. The above declared facts demonstrate that the following Utah insurance law(s) were not complied with:
 - a. Utah Code § 31A-23a-111(5)(b)(xiv) prohibits a licensee from holding a license if the licensee is convicted of a felony. Respondent was convicted of two felonies on January 22, 2019.

b. Utah Code § 31A-23a-5(b)(i) provides that the commissioner may revoke a license if the licensee is unqualified for a license or line of authority under Section 31A-23a-107. Respondent violated Utah Code § 31A-23a-107(2)(a) by being convicted of a Pattern of Unlawful Activity, a second degree felony.

5. Based on the facts and law set forth above, Utah Code § 31A-23a-111(5)(b)(xiv), and other similar enforcement cases, Clint William Nordahl's Individual Resident Producer License should be revoked.
