Complainant, Utah Insurance Department ("Department"), and Respondent, Jordan Edward Houghton ("Respondent"), by and through counsel, have stipulated to entry of the following Findings of Fact, Conclusions of Law, and Order. Based upon that stipulation, and good cause appearing, the Presiding Officer makes and enters the following:

### FINDINGS OF FACT

- 1. Respondent is a resident individual producer holding Utah license number 333954.
- 2. Respondent's mailing address is
- 3. Between April 6, 2020, and April 13, 2020, Respondent received 12 hours of Continuing Education credit for completing 12 online courses administered by Acuity Insurance

("Acuity").

- 4. Respondent allowed another induvial to log in to Acuity's continuing education platform using his credentials and complete several of those courses.
  - 5. Respondent's 12 hours of credit were cancelled in August 2020.
- 6. The Department and Respondent have agreed to an administrative forfeiture of \$1,500.00.

# **CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

- 1. The Utah Insurance Commissioner ("Commissioner") has jurisdiction over the parties and this adjudicative proceeding pursuant to Utah Code §§ 31A-1-105 and 31A-2-201.
- 2. The Commissioner has legal authority to impose penalties on licensees who violate the Utah Insurance Code pursuant to Utah Code § 31A-2-308.
- 3. Respondent violated Utah Admin. Rule R590-142-4(1)(b) by allowing other individuals to take continuing education courses using his login credentials to receive continuing education credit.
- 4. As penalty for the violations in this case, Respondent should be ordered to pay a forfeiture of \$1,500.00.

#### **ORDER**

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, it is hereby Ordered that:

1. Respondent shall pay a forfeiture of \$1,500.00 for the violations described in the Conclusions of Law.

2. Respondent is ordered not to commit the violations described in the Conclusions of Law in the future.
