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NOTICE OF AGENCY ACTION

The Utah Insurance Department (“the Department”) commences this agency action as an informal adjudicative proceeding against Respondent Anne Petrie (“Respondent”) pursuant to Utah Code §§ 31A-2-201 and 63G-4-201 through -203 and to Utah Admin. Code R590-160.

This agency action is based on the facts and law set forth in the attached Declaration and is designated as an informal adjudicative proceeding pursuant to Utah Code § 63G-4-202(1) and Utah Admin Code R590-160-4 and -7.

ORDER

Based on the facts and the law set forth in the attached Declaration, and good cause appearing, the Utah Insurance Commissioner orders as follows:

1. Respondent's application for a Utah resident producer individual insurance license is denied.

2. Pursuant to Utah Code § 63G-4-203(1)(i) and Utah Admin. Code R590-160-8(1), this informal adjudicative proceeding shall be deemed closed, and this Order shall become final and take full effect, 15 days after this Notice of Agency Action and Order is emailed to Respondent unless a request for a hearing on this matter is received from Respondent prior to that date.

3. A request for a hearing shall be in writing and sent by email to uidadmincases@utah.gov or by U.S. mail to Office of the Administrative Law Judge, Utah Insurance Department, 4315 S. 2700 W., Suite 2300, Taylorsville, UT 84129. The request for hearing shall be signed by the person making the request and shall state the basis for the relief requested.

4. If you fail to request a hearing you will be bound by this Order. Failure to request a hearing will be deemed a failure to exhaust administrative remedies and will preclude any further administrative or judicial review or appeal of this matter.

NOTICE REGARDING ENFORCEMENT OF THE ORDER

Failure to obey the Order may subject you to further penalties that include a forfeiture of up to \$2,500 per violation, with each day of the violation constituting a separate violation. Other penalties for failing to obey this Order include license suspension, probation, refusal to renew, or revocation. Failure to obey this Order may also result in an action taken against you in a court of competent where forfeitures of up to \$10,000 for each day the failure to comply continues until judgement is rendered. If you are licensed in other jurisdictions, you may be required to report this proceeding to those jurisdictions.

DECLARATION

Under criminal penalty of Utah law, I, Randy Overstreet, declare the following:

1. I am currently employed as Manager of Producer Licensing in the Financial Regulation & Licensing Division with the Utah Insurance Department (“Department”) where my responsibilities include investigating and enforcing Utah insurance laws.

2. I submit this Declaration as the basis for issuing the Notice of Agency Action and Order against Anne Petrie (“Respondent”) to which this Declaration is attached.

3. Based on my personal knowledge and/or based on the facts appearing in the Department’s records and files, the following facts are true:

a. On October 24, 2022, Respondent applied for a Utah resident producer individual insurance license.

b. On her application, Respondent answered “yes” to the question that asked, “Have you been notified by any jurisdiction to which you are applying of any delinquent tax obligation that is not the subject of a repayment agreement.”

c. On September 19, 2022, a paperless tax lien was filed, and a monetary judgment entered against the Respondent for income tax due from tax year 2014 in the amount of \$338.44 in favor of the Utah State Tax Commission. Based upon the court documents that I have reviewed, this tax lien/monetary judgment remains outstanding. (See Utah State Tax Commission v. Anne Petrie, Case # 226933099, Salt Lake County, State of Utah.)

d. On September 19, 2022, a paperless tax lien was filed, and a monetary judgment entered against the Respondent for income tax due from tax year 2017 in the amount of \$1,141.19 in favor of the Utah State Tax Commission. Based upon the court documents

that I have reviewed, this tax lien/monetary judgment remains outstanding. (See Utah State Tax Commission v. Anne Petrie, Case # 226934217, Salt Lake County, State of Utah.)

e. On September 19, 2022, a paperless tax lien was filed, and a monetary judgment entered against the Respondent for income tax due from tax year 2018 in the amount of \$3,777.05 in favor of the Utah State Tax Commission. Based upon the court documents that I have reviewed, this tax lien/monetary judgment remains outstanding. (See Utah State Tax Commission v. Anne Petrie, Case # 226933522, Salt Lake County, State of Utah.)

f. On September 19, 2022, a paperless tax lien was filed, and a monetary judgment entered against the Respondent for income tax due from tax year 2019 in the amount of \$1,121.14 in favor of the Utah State Tax Commission. Based upon the court documents that I have reviewed, this tax lien/monetary judgment remains outstanding. (See Utah State Tax Commission v. Anne Petrie, Case # 226934005, Salt Lake County, State of Utah.)

g. On September 19, 2022, a paperless tax lien was filed, and a monetary judgment entered against the Respondent for income tax due from tax year 2020 in the amount of \$23,038.92 in favor of the Utah State Tax Commission. Based upon the court documents that I have reviewed, this tax lien/monetary judgment remains outstanding. (See Utah State Tax Commission v. Anne Petrie, Case # 226933321, Salt Lake County, State of Utah.)

h. In connection with the license application, Respondent provided a copy of a “Statement of Account for Delinquent Taxes” dated November 15, 2022, that she

received from the Utah State Tax Commission. Based on information in that document, Respondent also has outstanding income tax due from tax year 2016 in the amount of \$636.47. (See Utah State Tax Commission document).

4. The above declared facts demonstrate that the following Utah insurance laws were not complied with:

- a. Utah Code § 31A-23a-105(5)(a)(ii) by committing an act that is grounds for denial, suspension, or revocation as set forth in Section 31A-23a-111;
- b. Utah Code § 31A-23a-111(5)(b)(iv) by failing to pay a final judgment rendered against Respondent within 60 days after the day on which the judgment became final
- c. Utah Code § 31A-23a-111(5)(b)(xxii) by failing to pay state income tax, or to comply with an administrative or court order directing payment of state income tax.

5. Based on the facts and law set forth above, Respondent's application for a resident producer individual insurance license should be denied.
