MANDATORY ORDER

Effective January 18, 2017

BAIL BOND LICENSE SUSPENSION: FAILURE TO SATISFY BAIL BOND FORFEITURE JUDGMENTS

Pursuant to Utah Code § 31A-2-201(4) and 31A-35-504(3) and (5), by Mandatory Order of the Utah Insurance Commissioner, ACE BAIL BONDS, LLC, IS HEREBY NOTIFIED THAT ITS LICENSE TO CONDUCT ANY BAIL BOND BUSINESS IN THE STATE OF UTAH IS HEREBY IMMEDIATELY SUSPENDED effective January 18, 2017 for a minimum of fourteen (14) business days for failure to satisfy two bail bond forfeiture judgments.

This Mandatory Order is based on the following:

1. On April 14, 2016, a bail bond forfeiture judgment was entered against Ace Bail Bonds, LLC, under Civil Case Number 141910728, David Antonio McCoy, Third District Court, Salt Lake Department, in the principle sum of \$25,000.00.
2. On September 8, 2016, a bail bond forfeiture judgment was entered against Ace Bail Bonds, LLC, under Civil Case No. 091412514, Preston Kent Gallegos, Justice Court of Salt Lake County, in the principle sum of \$2,500.00.
3. On January 9, 2017, after being notified by the Salt Lake District Attorney's Office of both the David Antonio McCoy bail bond forfeiture judgment and the Gallegos bail bond forfeiture judgment, the Department notified Ace Bail Bonds, LLC, of its legal responsibility to satisfy both forfeiture judgments within five (5) business days.
4. To date, the Utah Insurance Department has received no Notice of Satisfaction of either forfeiture judgment from either prosecutor's office.
5. Ace directly violated Utah Code § 31A-35-504(1)(b), when it failed to satisfy either bail bond forfeiture judgment within five (5) business days after receiving Notice from the Department.


Based on the above referenced points of fact and law, again, under Utah Code § 31A-36-504(3), the Commissioner is hereby immediately suspending the bail bond license of Ace Bail

Bonds, LLC, for a minimum of fourteen (14) business days for its failure to satisfy the two referenced outstanding bail bond forfeiture judgments. With the Ace Bail Bonds, LLC, license suspension, the Department will be immediately inactivating the bail bond license and notifying the Utah Courts of the license suspension and inactivation.

Pursuant to Utah Code § 31A-35-504(5) and (6), after fourteen days, the license suspension shall be lifted within five (5) business days of satisfying all of the following conditions: (a) the suspension has been in place for no fewer than 14 days; (b) the commissioner has received written notice of payment of the unpaid forfeiture from the prosecutor; and (c) the commissioner has received no other notice of any unpaid forfeiture from a prosecutor.

If the referenced bail bond forfeiture judgments remain unsatisfied for sixty (60) days from this suspension date, the Department will commence an administrative proceeding to revoke the license of Ace Bail Bonds, LLC.
