## • Old Business

- o Subcommittee amendments to 31A-19a-209 / Cal
  - Kim notes that at the last subcommittee meeting, the industry voiced a need for regulation and provided language that was amended by the ULTA. The subcommittee approved the language in principle at its Oct. 28 meeting.
  - Cal says the version with the redlining is what was discussed at the Oct. 28 meeting and looks good to him. Chase agrees and expresses his gratitude to everyone who helped with the process.
  - Commissioner Pike says this is the kind of thing the TEC should handle, and he appreciates the work it has done to respond to his request. He feels good about where we are, and wonders about setting a sunsetting date, which is commonly done by the legislature.
  - Reed notes that the language may not survive exactly as-is. The language is submitted to legislative drafters who may tweak the language. He's not concerned about meaning changes, but the specific language may be different. The bill will be up for consideration on Nov. 17 at its interim committee meeting. Reed says this specific provision is in some ways an experiment. The current language isn't reflective of how the industry does business, and there has been concerns about a race to the bottom. The UID wants to make sure to address industry concerns, and this is the way to do that. It's an experiment, but it's a safe one. He suggests that after 5 years, there may be better insight about how to deal with this particular issue. Rates may stay the same and not need to be regulated, or they may drop quickly and suggest regulation is necessary. The 5 year sunset would give plenty of data for the UID to make a decision. A sunset would also show certain legislators that the state isn't setting rates and being anticompetitive. He asks for industry comment.
  - Kim thinks it's a great proposal and a good opportunity to gather information. Chase thinks it's a great idea. Cal agrees. He notes that the 5 year timeframe would help with gathering information and whether there will be a race to the bottom.
  - Commissioner Pike likes this approach and says what the industry has proposed is excellent. This process is how he would like to get industry input on various title matters in the future. Together everyone has made something better than what is currently in statute.
  - Motion by Chase to propose that the UID include the proposed amendment to 31A-19a-209 in its legislative bill. Seconded by Cal. Motion passes 3-0.
- Review proposed rule change under Executive Order 2021-12 / Perri
  - R592-14: Unfair or Deceptive Acts or Practices Affecting Title to Real Property
    - Perri say this version is substantially unchanged from what was discussed on Oct. 28. The only significant change from Oct. 28 is striking "knowingly" from Subsection (2). She noted that Matt Sager initially didn't agree with the change. After rereading the language, Matt retracts his objection and supports the change.
    - Motion by Cal to approve the amendments. Seconded by Chase. Motion passes 3-0.
